



**Historical Balik Pulau Roundabout**  
Small in size yet big in history, this must-see landmark was the town's public pump as well as water trough for elephants and horses in the 18th century. The monument was built in 1882 by a wealthy farmer, Koh Seang Tait to commemorate the visit of the Governor of Melaka, Sir Frederick Weld to Balik Pulau. The roundabout marks the convergence of three main roads from different parts of the island.

Surrounded by scenic landscape, Balik Pulau is a township at the southwest of Penang island. Its name in Bahasa Malaysia translates to "the other side of the island" which reflects its geographical position on the island.

With numerous natural attractions such as farms, orchards and paddy fields dotted throughout Balik Pulau, picturesque views are aplenty. The one and only Balik Pulau Roundabout is a must-see landmark as it is small in size yet big in history. Built in 1882 to commemorate the visit of Sir Frederick Weld (Governor of Melaka), this is where three main roads converge.

Another prominent landmark is the Church of the Holy Name of Jesus. Built in 1854, it is one of the oldest churches in Penang. Over the years, this Roman Catholic church underwent a series of renovations comprising the nave, sanctuary, two wings, stained-glass windows, bell tower and tenor bell. Today, it has a splendid architectural design.

Back to Balik Pulau Market is a must-visit spot where there are food stalls as well as a wet market and dry goods section. Breakfast delicacies, fresh fruits, preserved fruits, meat and sundry goods are readily available here. Among the most sought after products are nutmegs, cloves, fish crackers, juice and coconut. Meanwhile, the food court serves local favourites such as assam laksa, char koay teow, pasembur and wan tan mee.

These attractions combined with the colonial era buildings, traditional fishing villages and Malay houses contribute to the rich historical charm of this quaint township. The emergence of modern developments can be seen with more coming up in the future. As such, Balik Pulau gives visitors a taste of old school Penang charm without compromising a slower and more relaxing pace of life.



**Laksa**  
The noodles are served with various ingredients such as shredded fish, cucumbers and onions. Steaming hot spicy soup is added to this mixture, giving it a delectable taste that will linger long after the last spoonful.



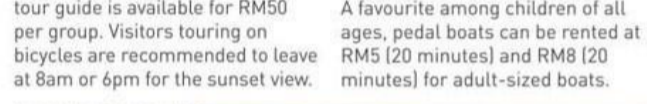
**Popular black sugar buns**  
Soft and chewy, the flavoured laksa is complemented by savoury broth and vegetable garnishes such as shallots and lettuce. Kim Seng Kopitiam, Cafe Ko Cha Bi and Laksa Pokok Jangus are some of the places that serve the best laksa. Want a light snack? Try the black sugar buns in Balik Pulau!

Enjoy a laidback walk or ride along the tree-lined roads and pathways. It's the perfect place to relax your mind as you breathe in crisp fresh air and take in the awe-inspiring views. With so much to see and discover, Balik Pulau is an ideal getaway for nature sightseeing and outdoor activities.



Back to Balik Kampung at Balik Pulau provides bicycle rentals which allow you to experience rural life such as paddy fields, river estuaries and mangroves as well as watching fishing boats and villagers planting vegetables. Most importantly, you can witness the gorgeous sunset at Pantai Malindo. All these can be experienced within a 4km trail (to and fro). Bicycle rental costs RM10 while a tour guide is available for RM50 per group. Visitors touring on bicycles are recommended to leave at 8am or 6pm for the sunset view.



Embark on a wonderful vacation with a dash of fun in the sun at the picturesque beaches! As you relax your mind and body at Pasir Panjang Beach, you can soak up the sweeping views of the long stretch of golden sand leading to the vast expanse of the sea.

**Malay Kampung**  
Known as "kampung" in Bahasa Malaysia, these Malay villages have traditional architectural forms that are preserved from several generations. They are detached and usually have no fences. Designed for comfort and practicality, these homes are elevated by stilts that protect them from flood and have many windows for good air ventilation.



Interested to learn more about Malay culture? Savour lots of Malay food at dinner with the host family and even play popular traditional Malay games such as congkak and gasing. Furthermore, you can also gain first-hand experience of Malay weddings by attending one or the family will create a Malay wedding ceremony specially for you!

Ideal for outdoor enthusiasts, it offers a multitude of activities ranging from mountain bike riding on three trails to visiting fisherman villages and houses reflecting the 19th century of Penang. You can unwind at the end of the day with a traditional massage and herbal steam bath.

If you love eating durians, don't pass up the opportunity to visit Bao Sheng Durian Farm. More than just an orchard, it offers accommodation options for an unforgettable durian experience. During your stay, you will be among the first to taste the special flavour of the newly dropped durians. Durian season starts from May to July. Call to confirm and reserve.

**Belacan**  
Keen on trying shrimps? Be sure to visit Chop Kim Hoa Belacan Factory! You can buy fermented shrimp paste and add this condiment to your favourite food.  
Chop Kim Hoa Belacan Factory is a third-generation family business which makes shrimp paste from krill to block. The company takes six to twelve months to complete the entire process in order to ensure high quality in terms of taste, scent and colour.



**Nutmeg**  
Did you know that nutmeg has many health benefits? Nutmeg juice helps relieve cough and throat irritation while nutmeg oil alleviates minor sprains and arthritic pain. This spice also detoxifies the body and promotes digestion.  
Rice is not just food; it is a key ingredient used to make a traditional beauty product known as cooling face powder (bedak sejuk). It is believed to help remove skin blemishes, improve the appearance of skin and relieve itchiness. At Lean Seng Cooling Face Powder, you can buy quality face powder and get a hands-on experience of making this product. Requiring only rice and water, the process takes up to a month for proper fermentation, grinding, filtering and drying.

## DELICIOUS & DIVERSE FLAVOURS



**Hakka Village**  
Hungry for local variety? Treat yourself to some Hakka Chinese food! Characterised as salty and fragrant, they usually contain stewed, braised or roast meats and preserved vegetables. Some of the must-try dishes are yong tau foo (tofu filled with meat or vegetables), Yam abacus, Hakka noodles and braised pork belly.



**Hakka Food**  
Hakka cuisine originates from the cooking style of the Hakka people. Staples of this cuisine comprise rice, fish, pork, and soy sauce while rice wine, ginger, garlic and salt are used to preserve and flavour the food.  
You can savour a delicious array of Malay food such as assam laksa, kuih bahu (traditional Malay mini egg sponge cake), deep fried banana and potato fritters available throughout the town. During your journey, remember to keep an eye out for the local delights ranging from eu cha koay (Chinese-style deep fried breadsticks) to coconut drinks!

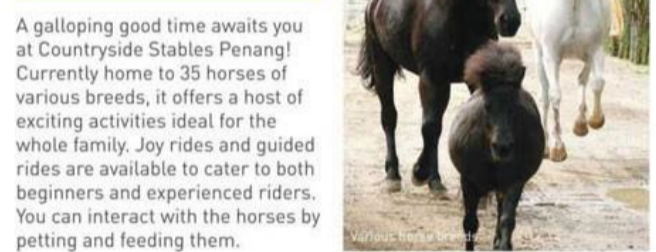


**Audi Dream Farm**  
Love animals? This well-maintained farm has abundant livestock ranging from fish to pigeons. Combined with a tranquil environment and wide open spaces, this is a fun-filled destination for both adults and children.  
Want a fun and authentic farm experience? Come on over to Audi Dream Farm! This family-friendly destination has a chemical-free vegetable garden and a mini petting zoo. Designed for easy exploration, the stone pathways wind around various animals such as goats, horses, camels, geese and rabbits. Besides feeding the animals, you can get upclose and interact with them.



**Saenen Dairy Goat Farm** is a family-run farm housing Saenen goats imported from Australia and New Zealand. You can opt to participate in a guided tour for a minimum of 20 people and maximum of 60 people, inclusive of a bottle of goat's milk. Goat's milk is a better alternative to cow's milk as it is high in calcium and fatty acids but low in cholesterol as well as easier to digest.

**Countryside Stables**  
Did you know that there are many different breeds of horses with varying sizes and colours? Here, you can discover various breeds such as miniature and pure bred Arabian horses as well as Shetland, polo, Thai, Myanmar and Malaysian ponies.  
A galloping good time awaits you at Countryside Stables Penang! Currently home to 35 horses of various breeds, it offers a host of exciting activities ideal for the whole family. Joy rides and guided rides are available to cater to both beginners and experienced riders. You can interact with the horses by petting and feeding them.



**Mangroves**  
There is a stretch of mangrove forest reserve located at the western shore of Balik Pulau. Open to the public, it has wooden boardwalks whereby you can partake in a quiet walk and explore the natural surroundings.

## ARTISTIC & CULTURAL MASTERPIECES



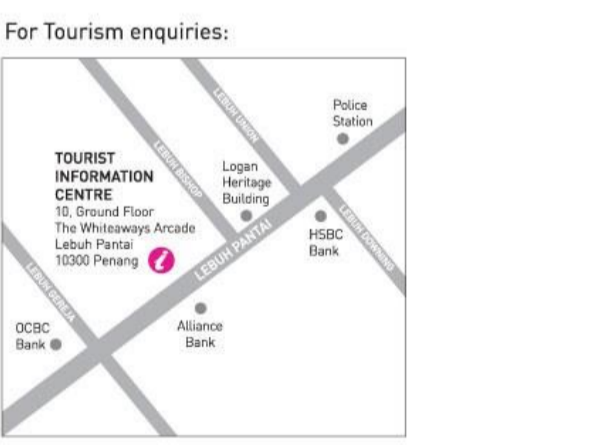
